New Heights Charter School of Brockton proudly announces the graduation of its Class of 2025, a remarkable group of 106 seniors who have not only met but exceeded academic expectations, setting a new standard for excellence in early college education. The graduation ceremony is scheduled for June 5, 2025, at 6:00 p.m., at Bridgewater State University's Rondileau Student Union Auditorium.

This year, every senior will walk across the stage with a high school diploma in hand. All 106 students have successfully earned 15 or more college credits, a testament to their hard work and the school's commitment to providing rigorous, college-preparatory opportunities.

Among these high-achieving seniors:

- 64 students will graduate with an associate's degree, having completed the equivalent of two years of college coursework while still in high school.
- 11 students are graduating with over 70 college credits, placing them well on their way toward a bachelor's degree.

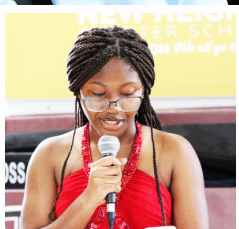
New Heights 8th Grade Step Up Ceremony

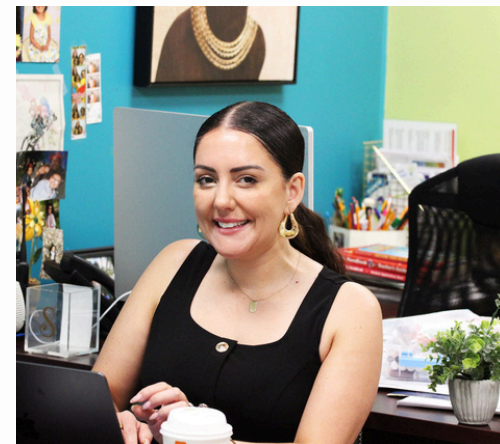
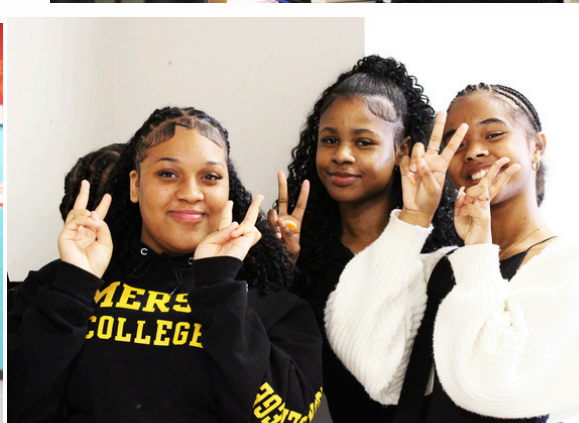

STAY HYDRATED
